

I take care of myself and my family; I protect myself with PrEP



1. WHAT IS PrEP?

AN HIV MEDICINE

PrEP protects me from HIV but not from Sexually Transmitted Infections.

PrEP protects people who are not already infected with HIV.

PrEP does not prevent pregnancy.





2. WHO IS PREP FOR?

FOR EVERYONE

Everyone can benefit from PrEP, based on their situation, after talking to their doctor.



3. HOW DOI TAKE PrEP?

I CAN GET A PRESCRIPTION FOR PrEP





MY FIRST CONSULTATION



My doctor explains what PrEP is and what tests I need to undergo; they tell me whether this treatment is right for me.







I can pick up my treatment from a pharmacy.

I TAKE IT EVERY DAY





It's easy! I take it around the same time every day, with food if possible.

AN APPOINTMENT EVERY 3 MONTHS



An appointment with my doctor every 3 months for a check-up and to renew my PrEP prescription.



PrEP keeps me from getting HIV

- it protects me

PrEP is effective when taken as prescribed

PrEP is an autonomous method of HIV protection

With PrEP, protect myself and I take care of myself and my partners



5. THE BASICS OF HIV PREVENTION

PrEP only protects me from HIV, not from other sexually transmitted infections.

I also remember to:



Use a condom, to protect myself from all other Sexually Transmitted Infections (HIV, syphilis, hepatitis, chlamydiae, gonorrhoea, etc.) Gonocoque...)



Test on a regular basis.Testing is **free** and **anonymous** in testing centres (CeGIDDs in France)



Take emergency HIV medication if necessary: PEP is another medicine that can protect me from HIV. It is meant to be taken following possible exposure (due to a condom failure, for example). It must be taken no later than 48 hours after unprotected sex.
